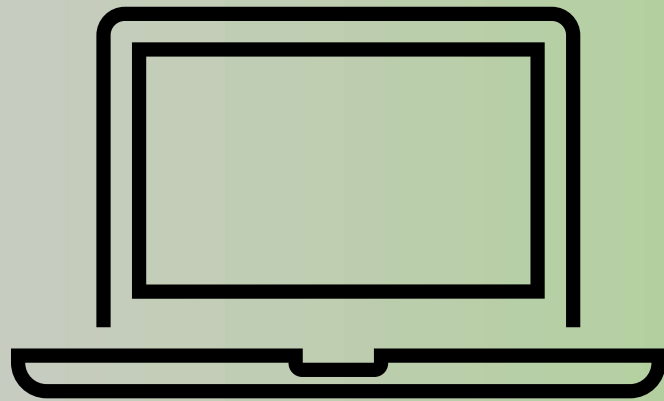

ECNA initiated the request for the City of Albuquerque to restore the landscape at this busy intersection. It took more than 5 years from request to completion with City and State leaders allocating capital improvement funds to the project. Call most successful natural landscaping. Wonderful for pollinators.

Next step in Landscaping Improvements

- Capital outlay funds (\$945,000)
- Manual to Rover
- start with cleaning up the existing plant material
- Get rid of Tree of Heaven
- Vegetation that can survive on rainwater
- Water harvesting



ADOPT A HIGHWAY – TRAMWAY (Hwy 556)

- ▶ ECNA has adopted Tramway between Rover and Lomas. Each Fall and Spring we clean up along the road and the bike path between these two streets.
- ▶ We continue to be thankful for all the volunteers that have helped in this effort.
- ▶ Since we began, hundreds of bags of trash have been removed from the roadway.

After requests were received from the neighborhood, ECNA worked with City leaders to get these busy intersections striped to make it safer for pedestrians



New 700 feet of sidewalk with benches and ADA rest areas along Camino de la Sierra

- Due to safety concerns for pedestrians walking in the street along Camino de la Sierra, ECNA worked with the Mayor's office and our Councilor to get the 700 feet of sidewalk placed that was never built along Camino de la Sierra northeast of Monte Largo.



- For 2 years a group of neighborhood volunteers have cleaned up the large triangle at Lomas and Sasabo as part of the Neighborhood Clean up. This year we added Camino de la Sierra. We will continue to work with Councilor Grouts office and the administration on improvements to the triangle area.

Safety reminder at the open space.

Because of a rash of auto burglaries at the Embudo Canyon Open Space parking lot, ECNA contacted Open Space Personnel and got additional Police and Open Space Officers to patrol more frequently and added signage warning of the danger.

Since then, crime in the area has reduced.
